

the tune the old cow died on!" Wow! Because I'm different in this way (some would say I'm a bit touched!) I was so fascinated by that profound statement that I instantly wrote it down. I researched the phrase on the internet the next morning and was amazed at the hundreds of pages of genuine scholarly interpretations there are in cyberspace of this simple phrase! Everything from Mrs. E's grandmother, to Mark Twain, and to the New Testament's Book of James!

After reading all of the many commentaries, I believe there are three main ways of understanding the phrase. The first is a minor tradition among banjo players in our Appalachian Mountains of West Virginia that has the cow being so captivated by the singing, that she dances (some researchers say "singed") herself to death. A second explanation (and what was most likely Ms. E's dear grandmother's true intention), says that in Scotland and Northern Ireland, when any grotesque or melancholy tune is being played and/or sung insufferably bad, people say, "That is the tune the old cow died on." James Joyce used the phase in this context in his novel Ulyses in reference to two of his characters having to listen to an intolerable temperance song condemning the evils of alcohol. Mark Twain used the phrase in his story Life on the Mississippi with regards to deck-hands on a steamship singing out-of-tune, sailor ditties one right after another. The English poet, A. E. Housman, in his poem, A Shropshire Lad, takes this meaning of the phrase to a deeper level, as a warning to young adults that it will soon be their time to endure life's repeated hardships and soul-sucking moments.

But there is a third, more profound and spiritual way to interpret Ms. E's grandmother's saying that people who study this material say goes back to the 11th century. The lesson of the words is that it was not the tune that killed the old cow, but rather the lack of food! Rather than having the farmer self-righteously serenading the old cow with stories of grassy pastures, she needed instead, actual grass to eat. In other words (and I quote the article directly) she died from starvation coupled with an overdose of advice. This notion of the spiritual value of the saying takes its precedence from the New Testament Book of James: "Suppose a brother or a sister is without clothes and daily food. If one of you says to them, "Go in peace; keep warm and well fed," but does nothing about their physical needs, what good is it?" James 2:15-16. NIV. And the whole thing goes further back to the Book of Genesis!!!, but I'm out of room.

Taxpayers can request a receipt by checking the "Check for receipt" box on the payment stub. If requested, receipts will be mailed to taxpayers within a month after payment is received. Taxpayers can view updated payment status on www.tax-lookup.net once payment is posted to the taxpayer's account, which usually happens within 4 days of receipt of check payment.

New this year is the "E-check" payment option. Taxpayers can input checking account information and make a payment through www.taxlookup.net. A service fee of \$1.50 will be charged. However, payment will be posted to the account immediately and taxpayers can print out a receipt for their records in real time.

Please note, the credit card service fee is displayed on taxlookup.net. Once the "Continue to Payment" button is clicked, the MuniciPay website will appear. Click the "Pay with E-Check" tab on the right side of the screen, and the service fee will change to \$1.50.

Please note the collection period for the 2021-22 school year will be over a 2 month period instead of a 3 month period. The penalty free period is September 1, 2021 to October 1, 2021, and the 2% penalty period is October 2, 2021 to November 1, 2021. Any payments postmarked after November 1, 2021 will be returned to the taxpayer and their taxes will be assessed, with penalties, to their Town taxes.
