

### MUSHERS, A DOG NAMED BALTO, AND THE LAST **GREAT RACE ON EARTH: THE 2024 IDITAROD**

is an epic sled dog race that captures the spirit of adventure, endurance, and the indomitable bond between humans and their canine companions every year. This arueling event takes place in the rugged wilderness of Alaska, covering just over 1000 miles in distance between the city of Anchorage and the village of Nome. It pits man and woman and their dogs against raw mother nature in all of her splendid majesty and brutal, unforgiving fury; it is considered by many to be truly "The Last Great Race on Earth."

Although the Iditarod Trail had been used by Native American peoples for hundreds of years before the arrival of Russian settlers in the 1800s, the present-day race actually commemorates a relatively recent event. In early 1925, a deadly diphtheria outbreak occurred in the north-

ern Bering Sea coastal city of Nome. On February 2nd of that year, a musher named Gunnar Kaasen and his team of huskies, guided by his lead dog, Balto, became the first of several lifesaving missions to deliver diphtheria antitoxin to the disease-stricken city. (As a point of interest, in Central Park in the great city of New York, there is a bronze statue of Balto inscribed as follows (from Wikipedia): "Dedicated to the indomitable spirit of the sled dogs that relayed antitoxin six hundred miles over rough ice, across treacherous waters, through tic blizzards from Nenana to the relief of a stricken Nome in the winter of 1925

The first official Iditarod Trail Race was run in 1973. Prior to this, sled dog racing had a long and popular history within the state. One of the more popular of these races was called the All-Alaska Sweepstakes. It was at this event in 1910 that saw the introduction of the first Siberian husky dog to Alaska. Before this, the primary breed used was the Alaskan malamute.

This year's race had 29 teams of 12 - 16 dogs and their sled driver (called mushers.) The trail is divided into 24 checkpoints, and the race is usually completed in 9 to 12 days. The winner was Dallas Seavey of Talkeetna, Alaska. His race time was 9 days, 2 hours, 16 minutes, and 8 seconds. The 2024 race was Mr. Seavey's record-setting sixth win. In 2017, Seavey also accomplished the fastest time for completing the race. That time was 8 days, 3 hours, 40 minutes, and 13 seconds, set in 2017. This year's race, sadly, was marred by the death of 3 dogs. Also, Mr. Seavey and his dogs were attacked by a moose. The musher had to shoot the moose, but not before the animal seriously wounded one of the Huskies. Although he required two surgeries, the dog did live.

The word "Huskie" takes its name from the derogatory term "Eskie," which refers to all Native Eskimo peoples living all over the Arctic. The word "Siberian" refers to the land of Siberia, presently Northeastern Russia. Some archeologists believe that the predecessors of the modern Siberian husky breed helped the early settlers of our continent cross the land bridge formed between North America and Asia during the last ice age.

Finally, and this is something I had to look up on Wikipedia, the term mushing refers to any form of transport powered by dogs. It is believed that the term has its origin in the French word "marche," which means to go or to run. A person who directs this form of transport is a "musher."

Facility Description: Applicant applied to the New York State Office of Renewable procedure is limited to ORES staff, applicant, and those persons or organizations re-Energy Siting and Electric Transmission (Office or ORES) for a permit pursuant to Public Service Law article VIII to construct and operate a 90-megawatt (MW) solar energy facility located in the Towns of Waterloo and Junius, Seneca County.

ORES Staff Position: On issuing the draft permit conditions, ORES staff takes the position that the proposed facility, together with the uniform and site-specific standards and conditions contained in the draft permit, would comply with applicable laws and regulations. ORES staff recommends that the Office elect not to apply, in whole or in part, any local law or ordinance that as applied to the facility is unreasonably burdensome in view of the Climate Leadership and Community Protection Act targets and the environmental benefits of the proposed facility.

Public Comment Hearing: A public comment hearing pursuant to 16 NYCRR part 1100 to hear and receive unsworn comments from the public will be held at the Waterloo Community Center, 3 Oak Street, Waterloo, NY 13165 on Wednesday, May 14, 2025, at 6:00 p.m.

All persons, organizations, corporations, or government agencies who may be affected by the facility are invited to attend the hearing and comment on the application and the draft permit conditions. Lengthy comments will not be accepted and instead should be submitted in writing. Equal weight will be given to both oral and written comments. To ensure that all interested persons have an opportunity to speak, the Administrative Law Judges (ALJs) may limit the time available for oral comments to three (3) minutes per person. The public comment hearing will be transcribed for inclusion in the administrative record.

The hearing location is reasonably accessible to persons with a mobility impairment. Interpreter services shall be made available to deaf persons, and English language translator services shall also be made available, at no charge for either service, upon written request to Chief ALJ James T. All requests must be received no later than 4:00 p.m. on Wednesday, April 30, 2025.





